The courses in green are taught in the student's first foreign language.

The course in *Human Science* is a combination of geography and history. The course will be taught in language 2 in 3. Secondary.

The course *Integrated Science* is a combination of biology, physics and chemistry.

From 4th Secondary the course in *Integrated Science* will be subdivided into biology, chemistry and physics. *Human Science* will be subdivided into geography and history. Both history and geography will be taught in L2.

The courses in PE, Art, Music and ICT can be taught in English, French, German or Danish. The language is decided by the school.

Optional courses:

In 2. Secondary students can choose *Latin* and in 3. Secondary pupils can choose between ICT and Latin. It's only possible to proceed with *Latin* if the pupil has taken the course in 2. Secondary.
